

Minutes of the 20th ICSC-Congresses at 24th of June 1990  
in VESZPRÉM /HUN/.

Commenced at 09.20 hours.

President /P/, Vicepresident /VP/, Secretary-general /SG/.

01. P. warmly welcomed all the delegates and expressed pleasure at the big turn-out with 19 delegates.
- o2. Mr. Panyi B. of the H.T.S.B. declared the meeting open, and wished everyone an excellent day.
- 02.1. P. asked for 1 minute's silence to remember the ex-Belgian chess-champion A.v/d. Linden who died in January 1990 at the age of 66 years. He played twice in the W.C. Individual Deaf Chess Championships.
03. P. the voting powers of the delegates were confirmed, with none outstanding the co-operation being very much appreciated.  
/SG, separate is enclosed a list of delegates and the total number votes./.
04. It was agreed that Mr. Ph. Gardner ENG would take the minutes in the English version in co-operation of the SG.
05. The following delegates were chosen for the election committee:

- 05.1. Mr. W. Niederer SWI suggested one from West Europe in the election committee.  
The Congress did not take it well.
06. The financial committee which had been approached beforehand by the SG were appointed as follow:

- 06.1. SG informed the congress that countries which did not pay subscriptions would not be allowed to vote.
- .a. Mr. K. Frydl explained the problem re: payment of ICSC subscriptions.
  - .b. Poland's case was similiar, and it was understood that their backward contribution would be met in due course.
  - .c. Spain claimed that they had paid their dues and that the number of clubs were incorrectly stated.  
The Congress accepted.
  - .d. ICSC- subscriptions from Bulgaria, Romania /part/ and Finland were not received in time although they were recently posted to the Secretary's office.
  - .e. Mr. M. Nikolic For future payments, evidence of payments must be provided, preferably before every I.C.S.C.-event, to satisfy the I.C.S.C.
07. Both ITALY and USSR were admited as official members of the ICSC. For the record, USSR have broken the 30 year deadlock in a bid to join the ICSC. They have 39 chess-clubs and  $\pm$  5.000 registered members.  
ITALY in contrast, boast only 15 members but their enthusiasm is very high. The Associazione Silenciosa Italiana Scacchistica, /A.S.I.S./ orginated only one year ago by Mr. Visco, is officially recognised.
- Interval at 11.00 hours /15 minutes/.
08. P re: the ICSC-statutes, it was agreed that all ICSC-delegates should only be deaf, and that no hearing delegates should be admitted in future ICSC-Congresses.
09. Mr. Gardner: There was a slight amendment on par.12.14. in Stockholm 1988 minutes:  
The wording " he would pay himself " should be deleted, and replaced by " his representative Association should pay ".
10. The Presidium's 2-year report was accepted unanimously.
- 11.1. SG. Norway paid up their 7 years backward contribution in full.

- 11.2. The former ICSC-president Mr. O. Punschke did not hand over all the records as requested.
- 11.3. After a lengthy discussion it was agreed that countries with heavy backward contributions should be temporarily for 2 years struck off the ICSC-membership. This applies to Argentina, Costa Rica, Iceland, Mexico and Venezuela.
- 11.4. The accounts showed a balance of:
- .a. 20.097, Sfr. as at 01.01.1988.
  - .b. 22.651, Sfr. as at 31.12.1989.
- 11.5. Mr. Gardner thought that the auditor's fee were much too high and suggested that ICSC look elsewhere, especially in England. It was stated that the auditor must be Dutch-based.
- Other suggestions:
- a. IFSD or FIDE to help?
  - b. Hungary hinted that the ICSC should spend more if they wanted assistance from outside organisations.
- 11.a. Mr. Lukacsovics, speaking on behalf of the financial committee, said that they have looked into the records and asked for further information from the SG, and found all was in order.
- .b. The financial reports for 1988 - 1989 were accepted by all.
- 12.a. Sweden gave a report of the World Championships 1988 and the main point was that the IFSD helped cover the costs, so no loss was incurred.
- .b. Mr. Holmstedt thanked the ICSC for the flowers when he was sent to the hospital during the W.C. 1988 event.
  - .c. England circulated written reports of the European Championships 1989 both in English and German. On the issue of having two English teams, the problem of meeting Poland's accommodation costs was clearly explained.

Break for lunch from 12.15 p.m. to 1.30 p.m.

Before item 13. was raised. it was pointed that:

- a. All future audiograms should be commented in English only and all tests should be carried out on ICSC-forms only!
- b. The ICSC-jubilee book had been written in English and German language by Mr. A.J. Boyce himself.

13.a. From 1980 to 1986, the former ICSC-President had, neglected giving out I.C.S.C. - diplomas.

14.1. Sweden objected on short notice of the proposals but on hearing ICSC's reasons, withdraw their complaint.

Proposals for Statutes and Regulations:

.1.1. If the audiogram for the participant is not submitted by the member Association before any I.C.S.C. event, a fine /to be determined by the Congress/ will be imposed. Accepted. The determined fine will be 20 Swiss France.

.1.2. The participant will be required to undergo audiometric testing and expenses shall be met by the said member Association.

Accepted.

.1.3. If any participant is found provened to be wearing a hearing aid during the match, this participant will forfeit the game. Accepted.

.1.4. Proposal by the delegate of Switzerland.

The members of F.I.D.E. with the identity card have the right to enter in the playing room. Before the entry, the chief arbiter must be informed.

Rejected.

.2.a. DDR's proposal for special application-form was accepted.

.b. Scotland came up with three proposals:

.b.1. One audiogram per person should be sufficient for ICSC needs, and only new players should be provided with these. Accepted.

.b.2. One invoice would be enough to cover all the costs, but ICSC preferred to keep separate payments apart.  
Rejected.

.b.3. Speeches at ICSC-banquets should be kept to a minimum, since many did not enjoy sitting through the formalities.  
Void.

14.3. As discussed in 11.3.

.1. To be struck out as member of ICSC: France.

.2. There had been no correspondence from Romania since 1983 but due to political changes recently, Romania contacted the I.C.S.C. and paid part of the backward contributions. SG proposed that Romania should not be struck off from the membership of the I.C.S.C. But this is to be reviewed in 1992. This was accepted by the congress.

Interval - 20 minutes break.

14.4. After a proposal by the Netherlands delegate, it was agreed that, having impaired the relationship with the I.C.S.C. Mr. O. Punschke is to be struck off as Honorary President.

15.1. The election committee, with Mr. Meurer taking the chair, announced the nominations:

- .4. I. Carmichael SCO asked for women's Individual Championships to be introduced in Scotland as a supporting event to the World Individual.
